Big turnout at Eco system presentations

The Eco system launch presentations went extremely well with considerable interest being shown in a product that we believe is destined for a big future in the UK market.

Already we are seeing the product specified on a number of projects throughout the UK and the first one, the Wavendon project, has recently been completed (see details below). Presentations on the complete Eco system were held at Reynaers' Birmingham facility

over a five-day period as well as in Glasgow, specifically for our Scottish fabricators. In total, over 74 people attended the presentations from no fewer than 41 window fabricators, which considering the time involved was a tremendous response. The new system offers reduced visible profile height as well as different colour options for interior and exterior surfaces, providing a great potential on a diverse range of building

applications. A rebate height of 22mm and tubular glazing beads can be used to increase burglar resistance by preventing removal of the glass from the outside.

"It was so pleasing that so many people had taken the time out of their busy schedules to attend and see for themselves the many benefits the system has to offer," added John McComb. "From the feedback we have had everyone found the events extremely worthwhile and we are already seeing the benefits with orders coming through. Hopefully, this is just the beginning for the Reynaers' Eco system, which should prove extremely popular with fabricators and end-users."

Eco in action at Wavendon Towers

Following on from our successful launch of the Reynaers Eco System, one of the first projects to showcase the system was phase one of Wavendon Towers in Milton Keynes.

The project consisted of two buildings, Cobra and Victory, named after code breaks achieved at Bletchley Park during the Second World War. Eco system was deemed the ideal solution for the business park project as it is functional, secure and its thermal properties ensure the comfort of employees within their office environment. Other Reynaers products such as CW50 and Vision 50, for the main entrance doors, were also utilised.

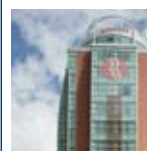
Marriott Construction, on behalf of the client Kier Property, had other ecological issues to



deal with on the site and spent considerable time planning due to the presence of endangered wildlife species such as greater crested newts, bats and badgers.

Structurally glazed curtain wall system makes for imposing façade

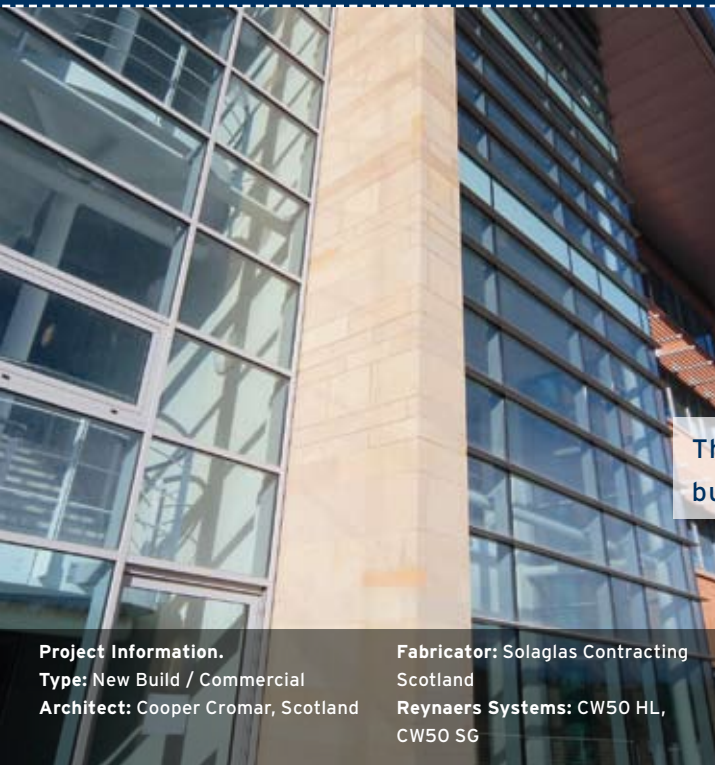
Duart House, the latest development on the Strathclyde Business Park on the outskirts of Glasgow, has utilised Reynaers CW50 Structurally Glazed curtain wall system on its imposing, raked glass façades.

Installation of the system was carried out by Solaglas Contracting Scotland in its first partnership with Reynaers. Architects Cooper Cromar have taken full advantage of the creative freedom that the CW50 SG curtain wall system affords, with the glazed façades angled to stand proud of the building's front and rear elevations to maximise the use of natural light.

The width of the product range means that any combination of vertical and inclined planes are possible together with the integration of different types of vents. This also offers extensive solutions for the different performance requirements of a façade.

Glazing treatments to the ground floor at Duart House have included curtain walling CW50 SG and CW50 HL - a curtain wall system with horizontal accentuation - used for horizontal capping on the project.

The new Sainsbury's store forms the lower floor of the newly completed £50m regeneration scheme and the whole building features Reynaers CW50 SC curtain wall façade and roof system. The CW50 SC was specifically selected as it provides designers with unlimited creative freedom, allowing maximum entrance of light into a building.

The structurally clamped system permits any combination of vertical and inclined planes, together with the integration of different types of vents, creating a seamless façade with no exterior capping required.

The benefits of the system are particularly apparent in the new store itself, where the expansive glazed area, stretching from floor to ceiling, allows maximum light into a unit with limited natural daylight. Moreover, the thermal properties of the system enable accurate temperature control within the store, despite the large glazed area, which is a vital requirement in a food retail environment.

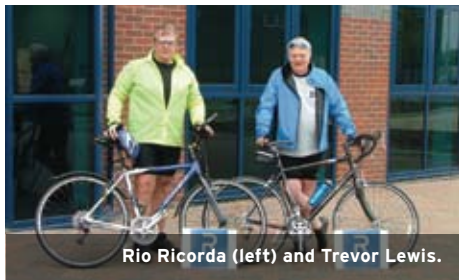

Progression on the £1 million warehouse expansion plans to Reynaers' Birmingham site are well underway with a contractor now appointed and work due to start in January 2008, planned over a sixteen week working schedule. The expansion, which will result in a 100% increase in warehouse space and the capability to more than double the amount of stock being held, will not however, affect levels of service to customers.

"It is a priority for us that, during the expansion, our customers do not experience disruption to orders and service remains unaffected" comments Reynaers UK Managing Director, Justin Hunter. "In the longer term, the expansion will guarantee consistent stocking of the key products for the UK market in order to reduce delivery times."
